As we climbed we stopped at various points and were given further potted history lessons. We eventually arrived at Big George just before 4.00 PM and were issued with ear plugs. Exactly on time(this did give rise to some discussion) the bell struck four mechanically although Dave Skelhorne pointed out the rope which went to a lower chamber so it could be rung by many hands. The bell has to be started by swinging the bell itself before the ringers in the chamber below can manually get it going. The hut which contains the striking hammer appara-



tus was opened up for all to see. Four o'clock having been rung most of the party went up to the roof of the building for extensive views around Bristol. Some of these views can be seen on the branch website under branch events.

Time soon passed and it was time to descend the the tower, and were shown into the Great Hall which was laid out Dave said, for retake examinations. He explained that during the last war a bomb went through the roof of the hall and it was destroyed. The Wills family paid for the repairs and provided the oak which was then growing on their estate with which the hammer beams and the panelling was replaced.

At this point it was 5.00 o'clock and people were having to leave. Unfortunately no one in the rush to leave to catch trains, buses and put money in parking meters had time to thank Dave Skelhorne properly although we did leave our donations.


The Annual Report 2010
