### **Ringing Remembers**

Here's an example of what some ringers are doing for the campaign to recruit an extra 1400 ringers across the country in commemoration of the 1400 ringers who lost their lives in World War I:

Huntingdon and Godmanchester bell-ringers want to recruit 22 new members to enable them to ring the bells in their three towers on November 11 as they do not have enough to go around at present.

Frances Smith, deputy tower captain, said: "The sound of English-style bell-ringing has been a special part of our heritage for over four centuries and our towers need some more people to help us keep the traditions going for the future, especially in 2018, as this is the year that marks 100 years since the end of the First World War.

"Although I haven't found any of the 1,400 were directly linked to one of our towers, between Huntingdon and Godmanchester we will need 22 bell-ringers to be able to ring the bells in all three towers on Remembrance Sunday.

"Bell-ringing involves control, like riding a bike, where you have to anticipate what the bell is doing and guide it to do what you want. Timing and rhythm are needed along with mental skills in following predetermined patterns."

Perhaps you have an idea for your tower to commemorate this important centenary. Give it a go and then put something in this newsletter about it.

Almondsbury – 1260 Plain Bob Triples – in memory of Freda Gearing – first inside in method for Dan Gearing and first as conductor in method for Marcus Booth.

Frampton Cotterell – 1272 Chester Surprise Minor.

Wapley – 1272 Norwich Surprise Minor – for Shrove Tuesday and a birthday compliment to Val Johnson (2).

Thornbury – 1280 Cambridge Surprise Major – first in method for Alistair and Ben White-Horne.
